Leigh Woznick:do you have to get permission for the students to do this beforehand?

Alice Yucht:see <http://www.digitalcitizenship.net/>, especially the 9 element of digital citizenship: could create a whole curriculum with that
Sue Ploch:I just emailed our tech teacher to work together with 2nd & 3rd graders & do book reviews.
Dana Cherna:blogs for student book club. I use a blog for class book reviews
Ronnie Gaskill:Informal book reviews
Alice Yucht:Blog for discussions of TED talks
Nicole Signoretta:our next big project will be the science fair - this might be a good way for students help each other out with their research and inquiry process
Martha Hickson:Blogs: Summarize library lessons; enable students to pose questions about the lesson and answer each other
Kimberly Hall:Sing Your Praises! Promote Student learning in your Library Media center through Video greeting Cards @ the Holidays!
