Sophie Brookover: (10:44) (You're at an academic library, right?)

Nancy Madacsi: (10:45) Yes, no programs

Nancy Madacsi: (10:45) No extra hours for finals

Sophie Brookover: (10:45) Definitely re-use ideas that other academic libraries use.

Nancy Madacsi: (10:45) Perhaps the academics could post some of these

Sophie Brookover: (10:45) Are there other special things you do at your library that students may not be aware of?

Sam Pharo: (10:46) How can we add pages to our library's Facebook page?

Lanora Melillo: (10:46) I am a youth services librarian, I see a lot of library facebook pages posting photos of children. Is that okay? We haven't done that yet.

Nancy Madacsi: (10:46) Program at VALE stated that academic library pages not successful

Sam Pharo: (10:46) As in, layering content

Sophie Brookover: (10:46) I also recommend checking out the twitter feeds of other academic libraries to get ideas from them.

Joanne Roukens: (10:46) What about highlighting databases and how they can help students?

Nancy Madacsi: (10:46) Good idea

Kathleen Gruver: (10:47) Lanora, we use a photo/video release form at my library and have parents sign off on it. Did that when I put up videos from a Silent Library program on our teen page.

dena price: (10:47) At my library we open our large meeting room as a quiet study hall during most finals.

Kathy Memoli: (10:48) School libraries could post summer reading lists, any after hours programs, book fairs, etc.

Judi Pecoraro: (10:48) We always ask parent or guardian to sign a release before using a photo anywhere. It isn't always possible or easy to get such a release signed, since parent/guardian is not always in the library with the children.

Lanora Melillo: (10:48) Thanks Kathleen and Judi. A lot of my teen programs do not have parents present, so it is difficult

Sophie Brookover: (10:48) I like those ideas, Kathy!

Barbara Weber: (10:49) if the person in a photo is not identified, is there an issue?

Sophie Brookover: (10:49) You could also (if you work a day or so during the summer) post about new materials that have arrived, w/photos of book covers, gadgets, etc.

Jaime Fauver: (10:49) At our high school, students have to have parents sign a media release form in the beginning of the year and we are made aware of any students who do not have media release and whose photos cannot be used

Sophie Brookover: (10:49) Jaime, that's great.

Judi Pecoraro: (10:50) for barbara, as far as i know even if you don't list or identify a person by name, if they are identifiable in the photo, you need a release.
